Information for Exhibitors

ABRIDGED RULES (A full version can be seen at the Trading Store)

- 1. Classes are open to amateur members of Purley Horticultural Society and children attending local schools.
- 2. All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor.

Vases will be supplied and must be used, where appropriate, including classes 36 & 37 (see note re classes 20-27, overleaf)

Entries must be received not later than WEDNESDAY 10th April accompanied by the entry fee of **20p** per exhibit, **except** classes **20**, **21**, **36** & **37** which are free.

No late entries will be accepted.

Exhibitors may make up to two entries per class.

Staging of exhibits will take place from 9.30 am to 12.20 pm.

An Exhibitor's Card will be supplied for each exhibit and must be placed face downwards with the exhibit to which it refers.

Judging will be in accordance with RHS rules and begin at 12.30 pm.

Prizes may not be awarded if exhibits are not considered of sufficiently high standard.

If possible, exhibitors are asked to name varieties to add interest to the Show.

3. PRIZES (Prize money will be paid from 3.00 pm onwards) –

1st - £1 = 3 points 2nd - 60p = 2 points 3rd - 40p = 1 points

The winners of classes 36 & 37 will receive a cash prize based on the profits from the sale of their bulbs at the Trading Store; no points will be awarded.

The Springs Farm Perpetual Challenge Cup will be awarded to the exhibitor gaining the most points in all classes. The George Critchell Memorial Salver will be awarded to the exhibit judged best in show for daffodils /narcissi, i.e., in classes 5-20.

INFORMATION FOR EXHIBITORS

- a. <u>Trumpet Daffodils</u> One flower per stem, trumpet as long as or longer than the perianth segments (petals).
- b. <u>Large-cupped Narcissus</u> One flower per stem, cup more than one-third, but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments.
- c. <u>Small-cupped Narcissus</u> One flower per stem, cup not more than one-third the length of the perianth segments.
- d. <u>Jonquils</u> Fragrant flowers, 1 to 4 to a rounded stem, single or double petals longer than cup. Perianth segments spreading not reflexed.
- e. Bi-colour Varieties The cup and perianth must be of different colours.
- f. <u>Primroses</u> These now come in a range of colours and produce one flower per stem, whereas Polyanthus produce trusses of several flowers per stem.
- g. If in doubt in which class a particular variety should be entered, please seek advice before completing the entry form.
